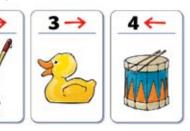

For 2 to 5 players, Ages 5 to Adult Playing Time: Approx. 15 Minutes

#### **Contents:**

49 game cards



1 Sherlock card



## **Object of the Game:**

As Sherlock goes around and searches the clues, it is important to remember each clue along the way. At the beginning of the game, each player tries to remember each of the eight items in the circle before they are turned facedown. Then, Sherlock travels from one card to another. Each time Sherlock stops at a facedown card, the player has to remember what object is on that card. Sherlock continues to move, as long as the player guesses correctly. If Sherlock travels to a previously revealed card, then the player gets to keep that card. The first player to collect six cards is the winner.

### Set up:

The Sherlock card is pulled out and set aside. The 49 game cards are shuffled. Eight cards are drawn and arranged face up in a circle.

IMPORTANT: The arrows on the cards must always lie on the outside of the circle. Even during the game, as cards are revealed or added, the cards must always be positioned so that the arrows are on the outside.

The remaining cards are placed in a pile in the center of the circle. All players now look at the face up cards in the circle and try to remember the objects on the cards. (Players do not have to remember the arrow or number on each card.) After approximately thirty seconds, all eight cards are turned facedown.

# Game Play:

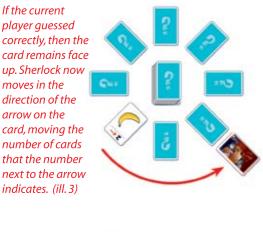

The youngest player will have the first chance to guess cards, and will start as the current player.

The person to the right of the current player takes the Sherlock card and puts it in front of any

The current player must now say what object is hiding under that facedown card. AFTER guessing what object it is, the card is revealed. (ill. 2)

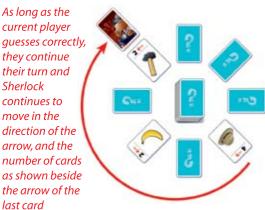


Now the current player must again say what hides under the card where Sherlock landed. (ill.4)

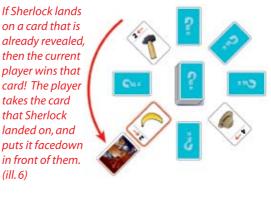

The current player draws a card from the deck and places it face up in the space on the table. All players have a chance to now see and remember the new card. Then, all of the face up cards are turned over, so that all eight cards again lie facedown. That ends the player's turn and the next player (clockwise) becomes the new current player. (ill. 7)



Play continues as described above. The player to the right of the current player puts Sherlock in front of any facedown card of their choice, then the current player must guess the object on the card - the current player then moves Sherlock as shown, and so on.

Very Important: Should the current player incorrectly guess a facedown card, their turn is immediately over. All revealed cards are turned facedown, and the next player becomes the new current player. The current player remains so until they guess incorrectly, or moves Sherlock to an already face up card (thereby winning the revealed card). Afterward, the next player in the clockwise direction becomes the new current player.

## **End of Game:**

The first person to collect six cards is the winner. For a longer or shorter game, the number of cards required to win may be adjusted.

### For Beginners and/or Experts:

Those that would like to make the play somewhat simpler can play with a circle using fewer cards. It is recommended to begin with six cards and then increase to seven and/or eight cards.

**Wanna Play Again?** Shuffle all of the cards and deal out a new circle. Because there are new items in new places, every time you play is different!
